








Types of BCDs that are also acceptable, although you may be required to place tape over the brightly coloured sections:




Below are examples of buoyancy devices <u>not suitable for shark diving</u> activities. Guests would be required to purchase alternative equipment or use a rental BCD:



Examples of acceptable fins:




Examples of acceptable fins where <u>some taping or temporary rubber spray may be required</u> to cover coloured sections:

This document is **NOT** a complete list of acceptable equipment, nor is it a requirement to have specific items that are shown as examples. However, *it is a requirement for ALL equipment to be dark-coloured* and with minimal or no brightly coloured elements.

The images are intended as a guide to show equipment types and colours that are suitable for shark diving and items/ colours/ patterns that are not suitable. If you are unsure about any of your equipment, please contact a member of our team. In all cases, crew decisions are final.

Photography

We understand that many camera housings feature sections/ panels that are colourful, bright, and/ or shiny. As these are hand-held rather than attached to your body, and can readily be let go of, (no lanyards/ body attachments are allowed) they are acceptable. We will only deny the use of a camera housing if it is overly 'bright'.

Examples of camera housings that would not be permitted for use during shark dives are:
