

Daedalus & St. Johns

7 nights - Red Sea itinerary

- Embarkation: Port Ghalib Marina at 18:00
- Disembarkation: Port Ghalib Marina between 09:00 10:00

Transfers from and to Marsa Alam Airport (RMF) and Hurghada Airport (HRG) on embarkation and disembarkation days are included in the cruise price.

Transfer times from/to Hurghada Airport:

- Hurghada Marriott Marina: 15 mins
- Port Ghalib: 4 4.5 hours

Transfers to hotels and resorts outside of the local area can be arranged for an additional charge.

Marine & Port Fees:

Governmental Reef Tax is 80 USD per person. These fees will be added to your invoice to be paid in advance.

Minimum dive certification and experience:

Due to the exposed nature and possible strong currents, some elements of this itinerary are not suitable for inexperienced divers.

The minimum certification requirement to join this itinerary is PADI **Open Water Diver**, or equivalent, with **at least 30 logged dives**.

Guests who do not fulfil the minimum certification and experience recommendations, or who the crew feel have insufficient experience in certain conditions, may be denied participation in some or all dives.

It is a mandatory requirement for all divers to have insurance which covers scuba diving activities, including emergency evacuation and recompression chamber costs.

Itinerary details

Number of scheduled dives: Up to 18

Whilst we attempt to ensure the number of dives indicated above is fulfilled, this is only indicative, and not guaranteed. Various factors can hinder the vessel's ability to reach, or remain at a specific area and may therefore affect the number of dives possible.

Safety and dive briefings are conducted in English. If you or any of your group do not speak or understand English, please let us know before you arrive.

The following is an example of the day-to-day itinerary.

Day 1: Embarkation at 18:00 followed by dinner and briefings.

Day 2: Visit a dive site local to Port Ghalib for a check dive before heading south for your afternoon dive on the way to St Johns.

Day 3: A day spent diving St Johns

Day 4: Morning in St Johns before travelling north to dive in the area of Cave Reef before continuing towards Fury Shoal.

Day 5: A relaxing day of beautiful reef diving in Fury Shoal.

Day 6: Visit the famous Daedalus reef and hope to encounter some large pelagics. A typical diving day is scheduled as follows:

- Briefing & Dive 1
- Breakfast, relaxation period, briefing & Dive 2
- Lunch, relaxation period, briefing & Dive 3
- Snack, relaxation period, briefing & Dive 4 (no night dives in Daedalus Marine Park)
- Dinner

Day 7: After an early morning dive at Elphinstone, enjoy a relaxed dive local to Port Ghalib allowing you to cruise into the harbour in the early afternoon. Take advantage of an evening onshore to purchase souvenirs and enjoy Egypt's famous hospitality before your journey home the next day.

Day 8: Following breakfast on board, disembarkation is between 09:00 and 10:00.

*We kindly request that guests check their flight departure times to ensure that they leave a minimum of 18 hours (ideally 24 hours) between their final dive and their flight home.

While we wish to show you the very best diving possible, a number of factors determine which route the yacht takes and which dive sites we are able to visit. Weather, tides, currents and how many other dive vessels are at a particular site, influence the Cruise Director's and Captain's decision of which route the boat takes and which sites are selected for diving.

The safety of all on board is paramount and we always do our best in offering diving at alternate locations should we be unable to visit those sites listed below.

Following is a sample of dive sites which we may visit during your time aboard.



Guests are welcome to suggest preferred dive sites to the Cruise Director. He/she will be happy to accommodate guests' wishes, providing it is possible and the schedule allows for it

St. Johns Reef

Located on the Tropic of Cancer, this chain of reefs boasts stunning dive sites, most of which are very close to each other allowing you to move quickly and easily from one place to another. This adds a lot of variety to your dives; drop-offs, tunnels and stunning hard-coral formations. One of these dives (St. Johns Caves or Umm Kharalim) is truly unique and is a photographer's heaven with rays of light filtering through into the beautiful tunnels. The reef formation is not the only thing that will stun you at St. Johns; the marine life and colours of the soft corals are some of the best in the Red Sea. With any luck, dolphins or sharks will join you on your dives and St. Johns will forever have a place in your heart.

Fury Shoal

This large cluster of reefs offers unforgettable and easy dives. From the northern site of Small Abu Galawa to its southernmost site of Sataya, Fury Shoal can prove to be surprising and diverse.

Each dive site has its particularity: from dolphins to stunning hard coral formations and not forgetting the two little wrecks "Tug Boat" and the "Yacht".

Daedalus

This huge tear-drop-shaped reef rises from the sea bed in the middle of the Red Sea, 80km offshore and more than 300km south of Hurghada. Easily recognised by its zebra-striped lighthouse, this reef offers some of the most amazing dives in the Red Sea. The sheer walls are covered in overgrown hard coral formations and a variety of reef fish. Napoleon wrasses and turtles are often cruising by, but make sure you keep your eyes open on the blue! Daedalus is one of those places where anything can happen...

Oceanic white tip, grey reef and thresher sharks are often spotted here, but Daedalus is most famous for the scalloped hammerhead sharks, which can often be seen in large schools out in the blue during the summer months. The sheer size of this reef means that you can do several dives here and never get bored!

Elphinstone Reef

A Red Sea legend; a finger-shaped reef, with north and south plateaus covered in hard and soft corals, unpredictable and exciting this truly is an awesome reef where hammerhead sharks are regularly spotted in the summer and oceanic whitetip sharks often congregate in large numbers during late autumn.
