

# Daedalus & St. Johns

## 7 nights - Red Sea itinerary

- **Embarkation:** Port Ghalib Marina at 18:00 only
- **Disembarkation:** Port Ghalib Marina between 09:00 - 10:00
- **Arrival airport:** Hurghada (HRG) or Marsa Alam (RMF)
- **Departure airport:** Hurghada (HRG) or Marsa Alam (RMF)

### Flights

We generally recommend booking flights to and from Hurghada International Airport (HRG) which is served by many direct scheduled and charter flights from the UK and much of Europe, as well as several flights per day from Cairo (CAI).

Marsa Alam is served by direct flights from London Gatwick, some areas of Europe, and Cairo although they are not as frequent as Hurghada flights, and may not align with embarkation or disembarkation days.

### Transfers

We provide a complimentary shared transfer between your arrival and departure airport, or a local hotel and Port Ghalib Marina on embarkation and disembarkation days only. Transfers on other days or from/to locations that are not on the route between Hurghada and Port Ghalib can be arranged for an extra cost.

Transfer between Hurghada and Port Ghalib Marina takes approximately 3 - 3.5 hours.

Transfer time between Marsa Alam Airport and Port Ghalib Marina is about 15 minutes.

Guests arriving into Hurghada in the morning\* on embarkation day will be transferred to the Marriott Resort in Hurghada (approximately 15 minutes from the airport) where they can use the beach until the afternoon transfer to Port Ghalib.

**\*PLEASE NOTE:** Guests arriving earlier than 08:00 a.m. on embarkation day are advised to book a hotel room and arrange transport from the airport to the hotel. They will then be picked up from the hotel later in the day for transfer to Port Ghalib.

Depending on arrival time, guests flying into Marsa Alam on embarkation day will either be transferred directly to the liveaboard or will be able to store their luggage on the boat and spend some time at Port Ghalib Marina, where they can enjoy the cafes, restaurants and shops before embarkation at 18:00

## Marine & Port Fees:

Governmental Reef Tax is 90 USD per person. These fees will be added to your invoice to be paid in advance.

## Minimum dive certification and experience:

Due to the exposed nature, possibility of strong currents and depth of some dive sites on this itinerary, certain elements may not be suitable for inexperienced divers.

The minimum requirement for divers wishing to join this itinerary is PADI **Open Water Diver certification**, or equivalent with **at least 30 logged dives**.

*Guests who do not have the minimum certification and number of dives, or who the crew feel have insufficient experience in certain conditions, may be denied participation in some or all dives.*

It is a mandatory requirement for all divers to have insurance which covers scuba diving activities, including emergency evacuation and recompression chamber costs.

### Number of scheduled dives: Up to 18

While we endeavour to ensure the number of dives indicated above is fulfilled, this is only indicative and not guaranteed. Various factors can hinder the vessel's ability to reach, or remain at a specific area and may impact the number of dives possible.

**Safety and dive briefings are conducted in English. If you or any of your group do not speak or fully understand English, please let us know before you arrive.**

The following is an example of the day-to-day itinerary. The Cruise director will usually schedule 3-4 dives per day; a sunset or night dive may be offered, where permitted, but is not guaranteed (night dives are not allowed in marine parks):

- Briefing and Dive 1
- Breakfast, relaxation period, briefing and Dive 2
- Lunch, relaxation period, briefing and Dive 3
- Snack, relaxation period, briefing and Dive 4 (where possible)
- Dinner

**Day 1:** Embarkation at 18:00 followed by dinner and orientation briefings.

**Day 2:** A morning check dive at a site local to Port Ghalib before heading south for an afternoon dive en route to St John's.

**Day 3:** A full day diving at St John's.

**Day 4:** Morning in St John's before heading north for a dive at Cave Reef on the way to Fury Shoals.

**Day 5:** A day of beautiful reef diving in Fury Shoals.

**Day 6:** A full day diving at the famous Daedalus Reef.

**Day 7:** An early morning dive at Elphinstone followed by a relaxed dive local to Port Ghalib before cruising into the harbour in the early afternoon. Take advantage of an evening onshore to purchase souvenirs and enjoy Egypt's famous hospitality before your journey home the next day.

**Day 8:** Following breakfast on board, disembarkation is between 09:00 and 10:00.

*\*We kindly request that guests check their flight departure times to ensure they leave at least 18 hours (ideally 24 hours) between their final dive and their flight home.*

We wish to show you the best diving possible and various factors determine which sites are selected to dive on each trip and how much time is spent at each location, including but not limited to weather, tides, currents, how many other dive vessels are at a particular site and restrictions that may be imposed, at short notice, by the Marine Park authorities.

## St. John's

The last frontier of the Egyptian Red Sea, St John's is a huge cluster of reefs covering an area of roughly 290 square kilometres. Between them, the reefs boast many stunning dive sites offering a lot of variety with drop-offs, tunnels, caverns, overhangs, deep walls and stunning coral formations. One of these (Cave Reef, or Umm Kharalim) is truly unique and is a photographer's heaven with rays of light filtering through into the beautiful tunnels. The reef formation is not the only thing that will stun you at St. John's; the marine life and colours of the soft corals are some of the best in the Red Sea. With any luck, dolphins or sharks will join you on your dives and St. John's will forever have a place in your heart.

## Fury Shoals

This large group of reefs offers spectacular and mostly easy dives. From the northern side of Small Abu Galawa to its southernmost site of Sataya, Fury Shoals can be surprising and diverse with dives ranging from shallow, sheltered reefs to sheer drop-offs and fast drifts. Each dive site has its particularity; from dolphins to stunning hard coral formations. For added variety, there are two nice little wrecks: Tien Hsing (Tug Boat) at Abu Galawa Kebira and the 'Yacht' at Abu Galawa Soghayr.

## Daedalus Reef

This huge tear-drop-shaped reef rises from the sea bed in the middle of the Red Sea, 80km offshore and more than 300km south of Hurghada. Easily recognised by its zebra-striped lighthouse, this reef offers some of the most amazing dives in the Red Sea. The sheer walls are covered in overgrown hard coral formations and a variety of reef fish. Napoleon wrasses and turtles are often seen cruising by, but keep your eyes on the blue too! Daedalus is one of those places where anything can happen. Oceanic white tip, grey reef and thresher sharks are often spotted here, but Daedalus is most famous for the scalloped hammerhead sharks which can be seen in large schools out in the blue during the summer months. The sheer size of this reef means that you can do several dives here and never get bored!

## Elphinstone

A Red Sea legend, this isolated, long, finger-shaped reef, lies in open ocean 12 kilometres offshore between Port Ghalib and Marsa Alam. Due to its location and exposed nature currents are to be expected, which are often strong and can be unpredictable, but with them come rich rewards.

With north and south plateaus covered in hard and soft corals and stunning walls reaching depths of 40+ metres, diving here can be challenging and exhilarating. Grey reef sharks and Napoleon wrasses are regularly spotted in the summer, and occasionally Scalloped Hammerheads and oceanic whitetip sharks often congregate in vast numbers during late autumn.
